


The Associate Director College Student Life Role: Kathy Cooney


Founded in 1971, Kresge was designed with concepts of collaboration and participatory democracy at the core of its identity.





UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE: Students under 18 years of age when applying for university housing must have their parent or guardian agree to the Terms and Conditions of residence during the online application process.

HOUSING OPTIONS/PREFERENCES: It is not possible to know whether the COVID-19 pandemic will result in changes to operations in student housing and residential life in Academic Year 2022-23. Consequently, the University is not offering a housing guarantee. The University does not promise or guarantee Student an assignment to any particular room or building in University Housing or any particular room/apartment. The University may reassign or require Student to move to another room or building at the University's sole discretion, which may result in adjustments to the room rate based on the actual room accommodation. Student may be placed on a waiting list and assigned housing if/when it

LEGALLY BINDING CONTRACT: Once a student is assigned housing the housing application comes a legally binding contract that is valid for the entire 2022-23 academic year.

CANCELLING HOUSING CONTRACT: Prior to taking residence, if your plans change and you are unable to live in university housing, you must return to studenthousing.ucsc.edu and cancel your application/contract.

If a wait list application is cancelled prior to a space being assigned, student will not be billed for any portion of the advance housing fee.

- If a confirmed contract/reserved housing space is cancelled, student will be billed for the advance housing fee and additional late cancellation fees may also apply (see section VIII for

After taking residence, requests for housing contract cancellation must be initiated through the Housing Portal (studenthousing,ucsc.edu), pending review by the housing office at your residential community. Moving out or turning in keys without official approval will not release you from your contractual obligation, and you will continue to be billed accordingly.

Disability-Related Housing Accommodation Needs: If you have documented disability-related ousing needs you must submit a Housing Accommodation Request form in addition to empleting the online housing application process. 100.00 POLICY ON STUDENT CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

The UC Santa Cruz community includes students, staff, faculty, and others who have a vested interest in the University. The University of California, Santa Cruz is committed to promoting and protecting an environment that values and supports every person in an atmosphere of civility, honesty, cooperation, professionalism and fairness. The Principles of Community further describe our campus values.

This Policy on Student Conduct and Discipline sets forth the applicable standards of our community and authorizes the administration of the student conduct process at UC Santa Cruz. All participants involved with the student conduct process are encouraged to reflect upon their role in the community and seek out opportunities for personal growth and development. The aspiration of the University is that students involved in this process will strengthen their competencies in communication, relationships, leadership, critical thinking, and active citizenship.

Except for Sections 101.00 (Student Conduct), 104.00 (Administration of Student Discipline), 105.00 (Types of Student Disciplinary Action), and 106.00 (Posting Suspension or Dismissal on Academic Transcripts) the Policy on Student Conduct and Discipline does not apply to student conduct violations involving sexual violence and sexual harassment (including sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking of a sexual nature, etc.). All such violations and the applicable student discipline procedures for responding to such conduct are instead addressed by the University of California Policy on Sexual Violence and Sexual Harassment and PACAOS Appendix E: Sexual Violence and Sexual Harassment Student Adjudication Framework. Campuses under local procedures may also apply PACAOS Appendix E to adjudicate student conduct violations that occur in connection with violations of sexual violence and sexual harassment. The UCSC Local Policy and Procedure for the Adjudication of Violations of the UC Policy on Sexual Violence and Sexual Harassment is located in Appendix W of the University of California, Santa Cruz Student Policies and Regulations Handbook.



Housing for Academic Year 2023-24

What is Priority?

Students with priority status are eligible for available spaces in housing before any remaining spaces would be offered to students without priority status.

- Not a housing guarantee
- Cannot guarantee a specific facility or specific room type

Maximize chances of getting a space in university housing by:

- o Indicating more housing types that they would accept on their housing application
- Be flexible with what type of assignment they will accept

Continuing students are eligible for housing priority if all of the following criteria are met:

- o Continuous residence in UCSC housing during winter 2023 and spring 2023 quarters
- Affiliation with one of the defined priority groups
- Active student status and eligible to enroll in spring 2023 academic term
- Apply for housing during the Housing Application Period (April 10 17)
- Must not cancel housing
- o If Housing staff make an offer, accepting housing when it is offered

- 2022-23 Frosh (Rising Sophomores)
- Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) affiliates

 - Entered UCSC as a transfer student in 2022-23 and affiliated with EOP
 - Also includes Enhanced EOP (eligibility based on a combination of factors: EOP status,
 AB540 status and financial need)

- Military Veterans
- Regent Scholars
- Renaissance Scholars

- Trans-Inclusive Housing (limited space)
- Supplemental Application Required
- 5- or 6- person apartments
 - 3 singles and 1 small double or 2 singles and 2 small doubles
